



Must have Trees



Heptacodium – This truly new plant for the landscape is rapid growing and able to be trained as a tall, arching multi-stemmed shrub or as a small, single stemmed tree. In mid August flower buds form on the ends of branches opening in September to clusters of fragrant white flowers last several weeks. As the flowers fade they are replaced by wine red calyces which remain colorful until late fall. Winter interest is provided by the light tan exfoliating bark. Useful as a specimen or in the shrub border. It is adaptable to a broad range of soil types, blooms best in full sun, but adapts to shade. Size 15-20' tall and 10' wide.



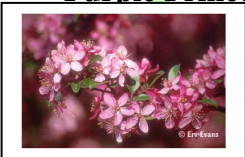
Cleveland Select Pear – A distinctive conical form makes this a great choice for street or yard planting. Gleaming white blooms in spring. Glossy green foliage changes in fall to purplish-red orange. Full sun. Moderate grower to 40' tall and 15-20' wide.



Sun Valley Maple – Forms a symmetrical oval tree with green foliage that turns brilliant red in mid to late October. The tree is a male and produces no seed. A cross between 'Red Sunset' and 'Autumn Flame' Full sun. Size 40' tall 35' wide.



Heritage Birch – A selection of River Birch chosen for its lighter colored bark and large, glossy, light green leaves. The peeling bark exposes mottled patches of cream, orange and pinkish tan colors. Full sun. Size 40' tall and 30' wide.



Purple Prince Crab - Bright red flowers are set against bronze-purple foliage on a fast growing tree. Summer foliage turns bronze-green. Young bark has a purple cast. Maroon fruit in the fall. Full sun. Size 20' tall & wide
